**STREET LIGHTING, LEASED FACILITIES**

**AVAILABLE:** Within established rate areas of incorporated communities with which the District has a Distribution Lease Agreement, subject to the established rules and regulations, including the District's current procedure for vegetation management so as to ensure the highest reliability of service for all customers.

**APPLICABLE:** To all night lighting service (dusk to dawn) from the District operated distribution system conforming with District's standard specifications and allowable investments.

**CHARACTER OF SERVICE:** The District will construct, operate, and maintain the complete system and furnish street lighting service every night from dusk until daylight, or approximately 4,000 hours per annum.

**RATES:**

**TERMS OF PAYMENT:** The above rates are net, with the gross rates being five percent (5%) higher. In the event the current monthly bill is not paid within the discount period shown on the bill, the gross rate shall apply.

**INVESTMENT IN FACILITIES:** The District will install, at its expense, additional street lighting units, served from existing overhead conductors (or an underground system at a cost comparable to an overhead system), provided the average extension for each lighting unit added does not exceed 150 feet of pole line or 500 feet of conductor. Extensions beyond these limits will be made, if feasible, under specific terms to be agreed upon.

**LAMP REPLACEMENTS:** Lamp replacements will be by the District without additional charge, except that any damage to lamps and luminaires resulting from vandalism shall be charged to customer at cost as a separate item on the monthly bill for service.



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**ESTIMATED KWH USED FOR STREET LIGHTING SERVICE:** Where the District's rate schedules applicable to Street Lighting Service are based upon lamp size and number of hours of burning and no metering equipment is used on the street light circuits, the estimated KWH used for street lighting shall be determined as follows:

**TAX CLAUSE:** In the event of the imposition of any new or increased tax or any payment in lieu thereof, in excess of that provided for under Article VIII, Section 11 of the Nebraska Constitution, by any lawful authority on the production, transmission, or sale of electricity, the rate provided herein may be increased to reflect the amount of such tax or in lieu of tax increase.

**LEASE PAYMENT ADJUSTMENT:** The basic rates exclude the cost of lease payments applicable to customers served from distribution facilities leased by the District from a community. Customers who are in a community served from distribution facilities leased by the District and upon whose



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revenues the District is obligated to make a lease payment will have the basic rates adjusted (excluding PCA) to include the lease payment using the following formula: basic rate x 0.10 for Amherst and Pleasanton; basic rate x 0.12 for Brady, Eustis, Miller, and Overton; and basic rate x 0.14 for Elwood.

GROSS REVENUE TAX ADJUSTMENT: Customers located inside the corporate limits of a community upon whose revenues the District is obligated to pay a five percent (5%) gross revenue tax will have the basic rates (excluding PCA, but including applicable lease payment credit adjustments) adjusted to include the five percent (5%) gross revenue tax using the following formula: basic rate x 0.05 for Brady, Elwood, Eustis, Miller, and Overton.

FRANCHISE FEE ADJUSTMENT: Customers who reside in an area where the District is required to pay a franchise fee will have basic rates adjusted (excluding PCA) to include a franchise fee payment using the following formula: basic rate x 0.03 for Hershey.
